Last week, all of Year 5 and 6 enjoyed taking part in a workshop exploring 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. Year 6 have been studying this play as part of their work in Drama and Year 5 have been exploring the plot in English lessons. Four energetic actors from the Young Shakespeare Company guided the children through key moments in the play, allowing them to consider the motivations of the characters within it. The workshop was a truly immersive experience and many of our pupils took on roles in the workshop, using token costumes to denote their character. A lot of fun was had during the afternoon and all pupils came away with a more secure understanding of the plot.





It has been a very busy week for the **Music Department**. On Tuesday, the Year 5 children enjoyed a trip to Birmingham Symphony Hall and experienced a wide range of classical music to tie in with their learning. We held two Mini-Me concerts - on Wednesday, Mrs Carey's cellists played with confidence and a lovely warm tone and on Friday, Mr Durham's bass players showcased their talents. Year 1&2 pupils travelled to Birmingham Symphony Hall for an exciting 'dino disco' where they had great fun and learnt a lot about different instruments.

Last Friday, the U13A netball team travelled to Uppingham to take part in the IAPS Netball tournament. The girls played some excellent netball on the day, just missing out on a place in the final by one goal. In the play-off for third place, the girls rallied and put in a composed performance to secure a well-deserved spot in the Nationals.

The Year 5 teams had a very enjoyable afternoon of football at Winterfold with some excellent goals being scored by both teams.

Year 2 children researched the life of Charles Dickens, as well as sketching a portrait of the author/artist in the style of the era, completing fact files, word problems and puzzles throughout the day. In Mathematics, children in **Year 1** learnt about o'clock and half past on analogue clocks. In History, they wrote about Charles Dickens and Christopher Columbus and in Science, they focused on the difference in daylight hours between the seasons.

Reception children have been learning all about tigers this week as they eagerly await their trip to the West Midland Safari Park. They listened to the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' and made fantastic collages and drawings of tigers.

This week, **Kindergarten 2** children have been learning about Chinese New Year. The children had fun taking part in the dragon dance using musical instruments and created beautiful dragon pictures. **Kindergarten 1** children have been sorting and counting objects into colours, creating a giant colour graph. They recreated animal movements to traditional African music, used maps in pretend play and listened to the story 'The Ugly Five'. The children practised their balance on the outdoor obstacle course and searched for hidden animals in the classroom.



In **Nursery** this week, the Ducklings have continued to learn and explore through play. They have enjoyed 'cooking' with play food in the kitchen role play area. The Goslings have explored the Small World animals and made pandas out of paper plates and panda collage pictures. The Cygnets have tasted different fruits and listened to the story 'Handa's Surprise'. They sang 'Five Currant Buns' using props and made Year of the Dragon pictures using paintbrushes in the glitter tray.
